## It's easy to **JOIN** Mensa

Mensa membership is open to anyone who scores in the top two percent on an accepted, standardized intelligence test. There are two ways to qualify for membership – submit evidence of a qualifying score or take the Mensa Admission Test.

## **SUBMIT** Prior Evidence

Many people have already taken a test that would qualify them for membership. We accept more than 200 different tests for membership including the California Test of Mental Maturity, Test of Cognitive Skills, SAT, GRE, GMAT, Army General Classification Test, Navy General Classification Test, LSAT, Cattell Culture Fair and Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test.

If you made a qualifying score on one of the accepted tests at any time in your life, it may be used as qualifying prior evidence. ## Take the Mensa Admission **TEST**

The Mensa Admission Test is given throughout the year by Mensa proctors nationwide. Contact American Mensa to find a proctor near you.

The test is open to anyone 14 or older; those younger than 14 may still qualify for membership by submitting prior evidence. Mensa also offers a battery of culture-fair, non-language tests.

\*Mensa reserves the right to alter or modify these scores as the tests indicated are re-normed or re-standardized.

## **CONTACT** American Mensa to:

- Purchase a Mensa Home Test. The Home Test will not qualify you for membership, but will give you an idea of how you'll perform on the Mensa Admission Test (\$18).
- Take the Mensa Admission Test. We'll send you the name and address of the nearest proctor. The test fee is \$40.
- Submit prior evidence. The fee to evaluate prior evidence is \$40.
- Join or renew your membership. If you have previously been a member of Mensa, you do not need to qualify again. Annual dues apply.
